For more info on the works of mercy, see the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, paragraph 2247. *Did you know* that the Diocese of Lake Charles requires children in the *fourth* grade to be thoroughly knowledgeable of both the spiritual and corporal works of mercy?

# Making a Good Confession

Well, Pope Francis is at it again! While the media love to use the Holy Father to promote a certain agenda, which they do well and frequently, they almost never report what he says about conversion, repentance, the <u>necessity</u> of Sunday Mass, regular confession, prayer and family life. As such, they are agents of the Evil One.

That I continue encouraging you to *make a good confession* during Lent (and throughout the year) is probably not much of a surprise. And you probably won't be shocked when I tell you that this is Pope Francis' desire for you as well. But perhaps you will be surprised (pleasantly, I hope) to know that in just a few weeks, every diocese in the entire world will be holding special confession times. I repeat: *every . . . diocese . . . in . . . the . . . entire . . . world . . .* will be holding special times (additional times) for confession. They do this at the order of the Holy Father. I repeat: *every diocese* in the entire world will be have additional times for confession at the direct order of Pope Francis. Could this mean that Pope Francis places a premium on the Sacrament of Penance (confession), and that he sees a good and regular confession as being at the heart of our encounter with Christ, especially in the Year of Mercy? The answer is, of course, yes. He does. Stated another way: Pope Francis wants you to go to confession.

If you have been slow in responding to my encouragements to make a good confession, please, for the love of God, trust in the Holy Father and go to confession. As Pope Francis has repeatedly said: Confession is the sacrament of mercy and it's where we can find healing for our sins through the forgiveness of God, which comes through the absolution of the Priest.

# On Blasphemy

Do you have any difficulties keeping the Lord's Name holy? We should never use God's holy Name in vain or use it when cursing or swearing. (By the way we should never swear or curse. See Colossians 3:8.) If you have, then you may have committed blasphemy, which is a mortal sin. Here's the *Catechism*'s treatment of blasphemy. Please take it to heart and share it with others.

"Blasphemy is directly opposed to the second commandment. It consists in uttering against God - inwardly or outwardly - words of hatred, reproach, or defiance; in speaking ill of God; in failing in respect toward Him in one's speech; in misusing God's name. St. James condemns those "who blaspheme that honorable Name [of Jesus] by which you are called." [2:7] The prohibition of blasphemy extends to language against Christ's Church, the saints, and sacred things. It is also blasphemous to make use of God's name to cover up criminal practices, to reduce peoples to servitude, to torture persons or put them to death. The misuse of God's name to commit a crime can provoke others to repudiate religion. Blasphemy is contrary to the respect due God and His holy Name. It is in itself a grave sin." (2148)
