THOUGHTS ON CARDINAL SARAH'S INTERVIEW

I'm wondering what your impression of Cardinal Sarah's interview was. Wasn't it impressive to see one of the most powerful (and humble) men in the Catholic Church call on all Priests to offer holy Mass *ad Orientem*?

As a Catholic (in general), the thought that we've done something that has eclipsed God from the heart of the Mass is rather frightening. As a Priest (in particular), that I could be guilty of such an abomination torments my soul. It gives me dread fear, for I desire that Christ reign always and everywhere, especially at holy Mass.

Please consider this question seriously. What if something that began with good intentions (i.e., turning the Priest toward the people) actually rubs up against the sin of idolatry? What if rather than facilitating your participation at holy Mass, having me face you actually impedes it, because it diminishes Christ from being recognizable? Some may scoff, but is this not what Cardinal Sarah has indicated has occurred by turning the Priest toward the people at Mass? Is it not fair to ask questions such as these, especially after hearing from the good Cardinal about the "necessity" of the Priest turning back around toward God at holy Mass so that God can be restored to His rightful place? It seems to me that only the coward or the ne'er-do-well would balk at raising such questions, but this is not the lot of a true Christian.

As such, we must be serious about our relationship with God, otherwise there's no point in having one. The holiness of the Mass (it's holier than any other prayer), moreover, must cause us to reflect deeply on whether we see ourselves as <u>servants</u> of God and His sacred mysteries or whether we prefer to exalt our own preferences to what the virtue of religion requires. Or, have we become so timid that we are unwilling to pursue what the justice of God's holiness requires?

May the Lord grant each of us humility and fortitude. The first will help us discover what God's will is; the second will provide us with the strength and resolve to bring it about, regardless of what it could cost us personally. God love you!
