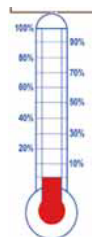
Cursillo Bookstore Holiday Hours

Divine Intimacy

I continue to promote the book *Divine Intimacy*, which I mentioned last Sunday. The author is Father Gabriel of St. Mary Magdalen, O.C.D. *Divine Intimacy* is a spiritual classic. The book provides a superb meditation for each day of the liturgical year. Reading it is like being on a one year retreat. *Divine Intimacy* usually retails for \$59.00, but SJoA has found a way to purchase it for \$39.00 per copy. I highly encourage you to order *Divine Intimacy* and read it each day. The meditations begin on the First Sunday of Advent (i.e., November 27th). The cost, when divided over a one year period, comes to 9 cents a day. (Not bad for a first class retreat!!!)

Benedictines of Mary, Queen of Apostles

The Benedictine order is comprised of men (monks) and women (nuns, or sisters). I will be visiting the Priory of Ephesus, in Gower, MO. The Benedictines of Mary, Queen of Apostles live there. I try to visit them every year or so. The awesome nuns are super holy. They are a young, vibrant religious order. Mother Cecilia, the Prioress (the Superior of all the sisters), is actually younger than me. We tend to think of religious as old, decrepit people. NOT THESE SISTERS!!! Their median age is probably 24 or 25. And they are not simply young. They are many. There is a constant stream of young women entering Ephesus. This will be an easy, but very important, way that each of us can evangelize our community. Be assured that God will bless our efforts with tremendous graces.
