# Follow Up On Last Sunday's Bulletin

Last Sunday, I attempted to summarize the crisis we are currently experiencing in the Catholic Church. I can imagine that some may have wondered (after the dust had settled) whether I was exaggerating or if I am simply a pessimist. I can promise you I was not exaggerating and neither am I a pessimist. I am, in fact, a realist, and a joyful one at that. There is, however, genuine cause for alarm these days, and only the most obtuse, it seems to me, could remain oblivious to this. We are experiencing, in my opinion, one of the lowest points in the Church's life, perhaps taking second place only to the difficulties of the fourth century. Anyway, as I was finishing up a long, but *very* good, weekend last Sunday night (returning from offering the evening Mass at the Cathedral), I settled in for a modest supper. During that time, I decided to check the news online. As I did, I was surprised to discover a new article written by Cardinal Sarah (the very man I spoke of in last Sunday's homily). In this brief article, Cardinal Sarah pretty much stated what I had said in my homily just hours before: the Church is in crisis! As usual, His Eminence's article is superb. I ask that you read it. I am including the article as an insert in today's bulletin. Please give it your consideration. ### Things you should note in Cardinal Sarah's article:

- ➤ Words used to describe the current state of the Church: *disaster*, *devastation*, *schism*.
- ➤ The Cardinal indicates that much of the clergy suffer from theological ignorance, and specifically, that they do not know the actual or real teachings of Vatican II.
- > Along those lines, many of the clergy do not realize the seriousness of this current Church crisis.
- ➤ The Cardinal indicates that "modern promoters" of the liturgy have caused serious harm to the Mass and the people's faith by assigning a multiplicity of roles to the laity during Mass, all under the rubric of what some mistakenly call "active participation."
- These activities at Mass are, he notes, actually *impediments* to encountering God in prayer. Such an encounter, were it to happen, would cause a person to confront his sinfulness and find conversion. Thus, the busyness seen so commonly at Mass these days by the laity actually *prevents* conversion from sin and growth in faith. True participation is, by nature, an *interior receptivity*.
- Many Catholics want to be entertained at Mass and make themselves the "center" rather than worship God. (Signs of this are: the removal of Latin, Gregorian Chant, Mass facing toward God, and silent prayers by the Priest at the altar in favor of the spoken language of the people, "popular" songs, Mass facing the people, and insisting that every word spoken by the Priest be audible.)
- ➤ The Cardinal indicates that, by and large, Catholics (including Priests and Bishops) have *abandoned* the Catholic faith by using Vatican II to reject the Church's tradition. (The phrase, "I'm a Vatican II Catholic." or something to that effect is a sure indicator of what Cardinal Sarah describes in the final two sentences of his article.)
- Finally, the man who wrote that article was hired by and works for Pope Francis. He heads the Congregation that is responsible for the proper celebration of the Mass and the Sacraments.
