## **FROM FATHER CONNER**

### **PASTORAL COUNCIL ELECTIONS THIS WEEKEND**

Elections for membership on the parish Pastoral Council take place this weekend. After each Mass, parishioners of at least 18 years of age may go to the Parish Hall to cast a ballot (one per person). Just below are the names of the candidates and a few brief details about them. Here's how the elections will proceed this weekend:

#### **Election Rules**

1. Parishioners at least 18 years of age may vote.
2. Each person may vote only one time – that is, cast only one ballot.
3. One man and one woman will be elected (top vote getter is elected).
4. Voting takes place after each Mass at the Parish Hall.
5. One ballot per person may be cast. No one may cast a ballot for another person. Thus, to use an example, a spouse may **not** cast a ballot for another spouse.
6. **No campaigning.**

#### **Susana Beaubouef**

Susana is married to Joseph Beaubouef. She is the mother of Drew Beaubouef; she adopted her Godchild, Cayden Beaubouef. Susana is a lifelong Catholic and dedicates much of her time to St. Joan of Arc. She volunteers in the parish by teaching catechism and assisting with the CCD program. She is a member of the choir. She is involved in Cursillo and attends Ultreya.

#### **Briana Denise Horton**

Briana is the daughter of Mark and Cynthia Horton. She is a lifelong parishioner of St. Joan of Arc. #### **BULLETIN SERIES COMING SOON!**

Beginning next Sunday, our bulletin will feature an excellent catechetical series which systematically explains the Catholic Faith. This series is titled: "**What We Believe; Why We Believe It.**" It is, quite frankly, superb. As such, I am very excited to have it included in our bulletin. Having these articles in the bulletin each Sunday puts a fantastic resource in our hands. It will be a tool for us. I encourage you, then, to pick up a folder or a binder and keep the articles so that you can refer back to them from time to time. Let Mr. "Joe Sixpack" (the author of the series ... *what an awesome name!!!*) tell you why he has gone to all the trouble (time, labor, expense, etc.) to produce it.

#### **MORE THAN A CITY!**

In the Ordinary Form of the Roman Rite, immediately before a Catholic receives Holy Communion, the Priest or Deacon says to the communicant: "The Body of Christ." The communicant, in turn, replies: "Amen." (**Note:** in the Extraordinary Form, the Priest says in Latin: "May the Body of Our Lord Jesus Christ preserve your soul unto Everlasting Life. Amen." To which the communicant makes no response, since the Priest or Deacon pronounces the "Amen.")

Several weeks ago (on the Feast of Corpus Christi), I began saying the words, "the Body of Christ" in Latin rather than English. [Okay. Time for a time out. Let's recall that (according to Vatican II) Latin, not English, is the principal language of the Roman Rite for holy Mass. Therefore saying this phrase in Latin is licit and in perfect harmony with the teachings of Vatican II. Okay. Time out is now over.] So, what is the Latin way of saying, "the Body of Christ"? It is *Corpus Christi*.

Did you know that a major city in Texas is named after the Body of the Lord? Yep. It sure is. Corpus Christi, Texas means "the Body of Christ," Texas. Since I've never heard of anyone getting offended when someone says the name of that grand city, I'd be astounded were I to hear of anyone taking offense when a Priest or Deacon says *Corpus Christi* at Mass during the Communion Rite. (Can you imagine the ridiculousness of not taking offense at the Latin name of an American city but of taking offense at the Latin words for the actual Body of the Lord! That would just be too much, I think.)

Anyway, I share this news of my change of practice with you for a couple of reasons. First, I want you to know what I am saying when people approach for Holy Communion. Secondly, we should not be oblivious to how the Catholic Faith shapes our world. There are innumerable stamps of Catholicism in our face each and every day (that city in south Texas is but one example), but do we notice them? Do we even care?
